

Dear Parents and Carers,

I can't quite believe that the half term break has arrived already! However, the timing is perfect for many of the children (and many of the staff too) who look ready for a restful week after a half term packed full of hard work alongside illness for many also.

We have received some questions over recent weeks regarding our system for communicating when your child has hurt themselves whilst at school. If your child tells a member of staff that they are hurt, even if a first aider checks for an injury and can not see any sign of an injury, to ensure good communication with you we will always complete a first aid notification for your child to bring home. We know that this means some of you receive ALOT of first aid forms! Every child is different: some are quick to tell an adult about the very smallest hurt, some are super active and therefore have quite regular bumps, others are so hardy they don't even tell an adult if they have had a knock. I wonder which category your child fits into? The system is designed to ensure good communication between school and home, to enable you to keep an eye on any injuries or possible injuries your child may have gained from the busyness of their school day.

We often remind you about Just One Norfolk and, as we enter into a week away from school, we want to remind you that there is a huge amount of support available to you as parents and families on this website or via their helpline. There are so many fantastic help sections within the website including some really helpful advice about sleep, child development and healthy lifestyles. I am also thrilled to see that there is the offer of free online courses to support you as parents. At times being a parent or carer is tough but do remember there is support out there for you.
